August Consistory Highlights

Guest Presentation: Jenifer Rachels, a certified teacher from Our Whole Lives. gave a presentation regarding the Our Whole Lives program. This program provides Comprehensive Sexuality Education, including not just what people see as Sex Education but also information about social, value, family, etc areas surrounding this issue. This program was created by two church associations, UCC and UU. She is exploring interest at PLUC for being part of this program. In order to be a partner there must be at least one leader, who would need to be trained and vetted, from the church. Parental participation is also required. This is a fact based program. Consistory thanked Ms. Rachels for her spending time providing Consistory

with more information about this program. Consistory will be exploring this program and seeing if there is interest in the congregation before making any decisions about participation.

Finance Committee/Roof Repair: The first payment for the roof repair has been made. This resulted in a decrease in the Vanguard account balance due to withdrawals made to cover this payment. The Capital Improvements Finance Team will be meeting on Monday, August 22nd to begin discussions on financing for the roof repair and other capital improvements that may be required.

Building and Grounds Committee: In addition to their work on the church roof repair, the Building and Grounds Committee Met with Chad Therrian from Global Surface Solutions to finalize an estimate for concrete work, which includes removing and replacing broken curbs and removing the unused light post base. Final cost is expected to be +/- \$4,000 (previously approved by the Consistory in July). Work should begin in two weeks, The committee also reviewed additional exterior lighting upgrades with Jim Northey with a plan to add solar lighting on several building corners to light dark parts of our campus, replace the lights on the legacy lighting poles with solar/led fixtures, and explore lighting for the sign and cross, discussed weathering of the exterior brick which will need to be addressed in the next few years, and. began to explore snow removal options for the coming season.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Peter thanked all those who help with Worship each Sunday, including pianist Susie Byykkonen, Jim Northey who works with our audio/visual presentation, and all who help as greeters, readings, etc. Pastor Peter has been looking at options for taking continuing education classes that are required by our denominations. He is hoping that he can do these online, but some may require time away from the area. Pastor Peter had been trying to upgrade our Webpage (it is currently down) and is finding this process very frustrating. He hopes to have the upgraded Webpage up and running in the next week.

Communion: Elder A. Campbell assisted with the August communion. Pastor Peter is hoping that other Elders who are not currently serving on Consistory might assist in the future. This call for assistance was made during announcement time at the previous Sunday and will be made again at the next Sunday service. **Vacation Times:** Pastor Peter will be taking some vacation time on Sunday, September 18th. Office Manager Smock will be taking vacation time September 21-27.

OLD BUSINESS

Building Use Policy: The Building and Grounds Committee has finalized the Building Use Policy. Elder G. Campbell moved (second by Elder A. Campbell) to accept this policy. Approved.

Online Consistory Meeting Policy: Clerk T. Monson is working on a policy for Consistory meetings held online.

Communion Servers: Elder A Campbell assisted with the August communion and Standing Elder L. Jambekar will assist with the September communion.
