Consistory Highlights

Budget Committee Report: Bobbie Dalquist updated Consistory on the 2023 budget and presented the tentative 2024 budget.

The 2023 budget is close to breaking even (only a small deficit) at the end of August. With the donations received toward the cost of the roof, the Budget Committee was able to move \$10,000.00 back into the Vanguard account.

In looking at the tentative 2024 budget, the committee made very few changes to expenses. The amount of income will not be known until after the Stewardship Drive. The Budget Committee is anticipating a \$6,500.00 deficit for 2024.

Discussion of Reports:

Office Manager Report:

1. The Office Manager shared some baptismal records from the 1920s that she had received from the granddaughter of the Houghton Presbyterian Church pastor at the time.

Angel Mission:

- 1. Elder S. Middlemis-Brown reported that the winter clothing drive is currently taking place with the Coat Give Away to be held sometime in October.
- 2. Things are currently going smoothly at Angel Mission.
- 3. Barb Brookhouse and Lois Jambekar are now serving as liaisons to the Angel Mission board.

Building and Grounds:

- 1. Building and Grounds has received two bids for the cleaning of the church carpets. Consistory is going to seek congregational input into how to proceed with carpet cleaning.
- 2. There has been some concern with the number of non church users of the parking lot. Consistory approved the use of church funds, not to exceed \$150.00, to purchase more signage about parking in the church lot. Approved.
- 3. Pastor Peter and Elder G. Campbell will review what groups are using the church, how many people are served, and what donation have been received. This will be a yearly review of church use to provide a better picture of how this ministry is being met.

4. The Fall Church Clean Up will be held on October 21st.

Pastor's Report:

- 1. Elder A. Campell assisted Pastor Peter for the September communion. Elder B. Brookhouse will assist in October
- **2.** Pastor Peter will be presenting two more Season of Creation messages.
- 3. Pastor Peter continues to work on a Prayer Chain which will be online. There are some glitches he is still trying to work out. There is also a need for more communication with the congregation about how the Prayer Chain will work.
- 4. Up to 10 students have been attending Sunday Service following a successful Afternoon on the Town. Nancy Byers Sprague is now the PLUC liaison to Campus Cooperative Ministries. PLUC will be participating in the MTU Faith Fair on October 4th from 12:00 Noon 2:00 pm. Pastor Peter will be exploring interest among students for a Progressive Christian Group. We will also provide the main dish, spaghetti, for the Student Progressive Dinner to be held on October 8th.
- 5. Pastor Peter will be taking communion to our home bound members and friends on Communion Sunday (first Sunday of the month). If people are interested in helping with this ministry they should contact Pastor Peter.
- **6.** Pastor Peter fixed the accordion doors between the sanctuary and Fellowship Hall.
- 7. Pastor Peter attended the Fall Presbytery Meeting. After speaking with members of other congregations, he is feeling very positive about the vitality of our congregation.

Old Business

1. Office Manager Leave Policy: The discussion of the Office Manager Leave Policy was tabled.

New Business

- 1. Congregational Meetings: By unanimous consent the Fall meeting of the Congregation was set for October 29th with the Spring meeting to be held on February 11th.
- 2. PLUC will again partner with Good Shepherd Lutheran Church for Advent services.
- 3. The Greening of the Church will take place on December 3rd.

The big story for September was the successful School Backpack Program lead by Lois Jambekar. She managed the program and filled 136 backpacks for students from pre-school to college at a cost of about \$1000. We thank Lois for her ongoing dedication and fulfilling this daunting task!

The interior of the food pantry is getting a facelift. We had the roof replaced and the exterior wall fixed after a leakage problem last winter. Now the wallboard and baseboard are receiving attention, and the

large commercial kitchen hood will be removed. We intend to add a commercial sink and, eventually, to install flooring over the concrete.

The food pantry continues to be busy. Our old source of USDA food has been closed and our new source has not offered the foods that we need, causing us to purchase food from area grocery stores. We ask for assistance with both perishable and non-perishable donations from the community. Please talk to Lois, Barb, or Sherry if you wish to donate perishable food. The Michigan Department of Natural Resources donated fish taken during research, Incredible Bank donated fresh corn, and Calumet Electronics gave us a sizable cash donation. Thank you to all as we continue to feed about 200 people each month.

Our Winter Wear Giveaway is in mid-October and we are currently in our Winter Wear Drive. If you have gently used coats, snow pants, boots, waterproof gloves, or hats, please consider donating them as soon as possible. Donations can be placed in or on the collection bin at church. We will announce the dates for the giveaway as soon as we have them. We expect that church members will transport Tech students in need of winter wear to Calumet as well. More About the Backpacks

The Copper Country Angel Mission really appreciates all the support you have given to their Backpack Program over the years. Members from the church have been very supportive of the Program by donating backpacks, school supplies and money since the program began about ten years ago. Over the past four years the program has gotten more elaborate and now the program gets lists from the schools of what school items

are recommended for each grade level. We tried to fill the backpacks as close to the guidelines as possible. This year we filled 136 backpacks for children ranging from preschool to college. The middle school and high school student's backpacks were quite full.

Also part of the program donation boxes were put in various businesses for donations of underwear and socks besides school supplies. When parents came to pick up their children's backpacks they got to pick up new underwear, socks, and some other new clothing for each child. Parents and children were happy and thankful for all that they received.

The next Angel Mission project is the Copper Country Coat Give Away which will be held sometime in October. They need coats, particularly men's coats; but they also need boots all sizes, gloves/mittens, and snow pants. If you have winter items that are in good condition that you don't wear anymore, you can bring them to church and put them in the two binds located in the church.
