Consistory Highlights

2024 Budget: Finance Committee co-chair Bobbie Dalquist presented the proposed 2024 PLUC budget. The Finance Committee is recommending a 5% increase in Pledges, leaving Unpledged the same as 2023, and slightly increasing the proposed amount for Loose Plate giving. The committee proposes a few changes in expenses including increasing amounts for maintenance and supplies, raising the amount for insurance and Workman's Compensation, and adding a line to cover the cost of technology (software licenses). They proposed two budgets, one for no raises for staff and one with small raises. (At this time the Office Manager and Pastor left the meeting while Consistory discussed raises.) Upon their return, Consistory accepted the recommended budget with staff raises to be presented to the congregation at the October 29, 2023 meeting of the Congregation/Corporation.

Discussion of Reports:

Office Manager Report:

1. The Office Manager medical appointment for October 10, 2023 had to be canceled as she had

- covid. The appointment has been rescheduled for December 12, 2023 so the office will be closed that day. Office Manager Smock also shared dates that the office will be closed for holidays: Thanksgiving November 23, Christmas December 25, and New Year's Day-January 1.
- 2. Angel Mission: Elders S.
 Middlemis-Brown and B.
 Brookhouse shared that a lot of people attended the Angel Mission Winter Clothing Drive this year. Even with the food pantry being closed for half of September due to work being done on the pantry area, Angel Mission still provided food assistance to 70 people. A total of 399 people received help from Angel Mission in September.

Building and Grounds:

1. Houghton is putting in new "feeder" powerlines to MTU with part of the easement going across PLUC property. The church has received an offer from ATC, the company doing this work, for payment of this easement. They have offered \$5700.00 for the easement, plus \$2,500 if we respond by 11/16, 2023

and an additional \$2,500 if we allow them to use herbicide. Consistory is researching this offer and will make a decision at their November meeting (which has been moved to Wednesday, 11/08 to both meet this deadline plus not conflict with something else scheduled at the church on their normal meeting date).

Pastor's Report:

- 1. Communion: Elder B. Brookhouse assisted with communion in October. Elder G. Campbell will assist in November.
- **2.** Pastor Peter reported that he continues to provide Congregational Care.
- 3. Nancy Byers Sprague has been busy with Campus Cooperative Ministries. PLUC provided the largest group for the main course of the Student Progressive Dinner (about 25 people). Jon Koskiniemi and Brian Hirvelä provided the spaghetti (both the supplies and the preparation) for the dinner. Consistory voted to reimburse Jon and Brian \$75.00 for the cost of Progressive Dinner supplies.
- **4.** Brian Hirvela helped Pastor Peter during the MTU Faith Fair.
- 5. Pastor Peter will be away on Sunday, November 12th. Dianne Sprague will lead the service that day.

Old Business

1. **Carpet Cleaning:** Building and Grounds will explore the possibility of renting Carpet Cleaning equipment and hiring students to do the cleaning of the church carpets.

New Business

- 1. PLUC will again collect "Holiday Bucks" to provide ham and turkeys to Angel Mission.
- 2. Ideas of topics for the Congregational Meeting were discussed.

Highlights from the Meeting of the Congregation/Corporation

Pastor's Report: Pastor Peter began by looking back over the successes of 2023. We are returning to pre-pandemic levels. Attendance is up, we have more special music, groups (Recovery Groups every day of the week), International Neighbors, recitals, Susie Byykkonen teaching MTU piano classes (they get a PE credit), and other local groups have returned. Pastor Peter thanked the many people who volunteer for greeting, reading the scriptures, offering prayers, providing coffee and snacks after worship, sharing their musical gifts, and many other things that allow us to worship together. He thanked Fellowship Guilds for their successful luncheons and rummage sales. The Building and Grounds Committee has been very busy updating the parking lot and many people have helped keep our garden beautiful. PLUC continues to reach out to the those in need in the community through the Helping Hands Ministry and the support of Angel Mission.

Budget: Bobbie Dalquist, Co-Chair of the Finance Committee, discussed the 2023 Budget results as of September and presented the 2024 budget draft. The 2023 Financial Report shows that we will not be as over our budget as was anticipated at the beginning of the year. Pledged, Unpledged, and Loose Plate giving are on target to meet budgeted goals. Some expenses have been over what was budgeted as prices continue to increase.

The tentative 2024 budget was shared with the congregation. The Finance Committee based the budget on a 5% increase in giving. The committee produced two budgets, one including 5% raises for the pastor and staff and one without. Consistory requested that the budget with raises be presented to the congregation. Pledges and loose plate giving were increased with unpledged amounts remaining the same. Most of the expenses stayed the same with a few things like maintenance and insurance receiving small increases. The Stewardship Drive will begin the week of October 30, 2023 with the final budget presented at the February Meeting of the Congregation.
