The Presbytery of Mackinac will continue to support their mission through Angel Mission for another year. We are very appreciative of that financial support. We received \$1000.00 from an IRA donation. This is a great way for you to give and avoid taxes to both the church and to Angel Mission.

A small grant helped the food pantry to buy locally the items that they cannot purchase through the USDA Surplus Food program. A separate grant was for personal hygiene products. People often don't think of the need for personal hygiene products when donating to a food pantry, but those items are greatly needed and unavailable at discounted prices through the USDA. The food pantry served a few less people in February (61 orders, 160 people,

111 adults, 49 kids, 6 new, and 1 emergency pack), but February was a short month, and some clients may have been able to stretch funds to the end of the month.

Our next major renovation to our building is to replace siding and add an overhang for the ADA entrance. This is possible through generous contributions from our community. We hope not only to make the building weather tight, but also to enhance the appearance of the Historical District with our renovations.

Volunteers gave 353 ½ in the store in February, but our board members have not entered their hours, which should add about 100 hours to our total.
