Our numbers for May indicate a *slight* downturn in the requests for food pantry assistance, but the numbers are still high. We have spent the \$2500 food pantry grant from Copper Shores CHF and are more than halfway through the budgeted amount for this year! Donations of food and \$\$\$ are appreciated to meet the needs of our community. We have also had an uptick in the need for shut-off prevention and medical

transportation assistance.

We are in the final stages of setting up the siding project for our building. As you may have noticed, our building isn't entirely weather-tight with rotted siding on the north side and back. The front is a bit wonky looking too. We hope to improve curbappeal in the Historic District as well as weather tightness. We couldn't accomplish this without the generous donations from the Copper Shores CHF sponsored #GivingTuesday event in November 2023. Keep us in mind for #GivingTuesday 2024!

We completed the installation of a commercial utility sink in the food pantry with volunteer assistance and our licensed electrician added electricity to a room without lights. We don't cut back on our services to meet these structural needs, but rather, use donations and grants given for this purpose. We still have a lot of work to do, but we are slowly moving forward as funds permit.

Come visit, do some shopping, recycle gently used items, and give a donation to represent the value of what you take. Your shopping helps to keep us moving forward in our mission to assist those in need with kindness and dignity.

Children's Corner

Here is a fun craft project to help children learn the beatitudes.

Materials needed:

- Various colors of construction paper Scissors
- Large paper plates
- Stick glue
- Markers

Mount

- 1. Blessed are the poor in spirit
- 2. Blessed are they who mourn
- 3. Blessed are the meek
- 4. Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for righteousness
- 5. Blessed are the merciful
- 6. Blessed are the pure of heart
- 7. Blessed are the peacemakers
- 8. Blessed are they who are persecuted for righteousness

Craft Preparation

Cut the various colored pieces of construction paper in half.

Have eight halves for each child.

Craft Instructions

Have the children follow these steps:

- 1. Trace their hand on all eight half-sheets and cut them out.
- 2. On the plate, write "BLESSED ARE" in the center
- 3. On the hands write out the eight Beatitudes.
- 4. Glue the hands facing outward to the paper plate, starting at the ridges or rim, so

that the fingers dangle outward over the rim. To get them evenly spaced, first glue one at noon, one at 3:00, one at 6:00, one at 9:00. Fill in the other four evenly in between.

Encourage them to hang the wreath in their rooms where it can help them memorize the Beatitudes!
