July has been a busy month with a lot of unexpected work accomplished. There were many, many clothing and household donations that swamped the sorters in the free store. In addition, we had a group of high-school-age campers from Camp Luther in Three Lakes, Wisconsin, near Eagle River, come and do some very heavy lifting for us, figuratively and literally! The upstairs of our building had totes and boxes in rows and piles without any organization. We also had about 20 beds and 30 walkers and other medical assistance equipment filling two large rooms. Now, the beds are at the ReStore and the medical equipment is at St. Vincent's in Hancock. The totes are neatly stacked with each program in a separate room. The assembly area for the School Backpack Program is ready for school supplies. We could not have done it

without the campers doing the physical work. Thank you, Camp Luther. The campers will spend their final workday filling backpacks on August 6.

Speaking of school supplies, it is that time again! Please, donate school supplies and backpacks by dropping them at church, at Angel Mission, or at one of the stores with our collection boxes. We welcome monetary donations, as we usually need to purchase calculators and geometry kits for middle school students, and hygiene products for high schoolers. 2024 Leap Year Mission Gift Challenge from the Presbytery of Mackinac

Back in March, a letter went to the Clerks of Session (our Consistory) about the Leap Year Mission Gift Challenge. Our Presbytery has cut the Mission budget by \$17,000 because of the lack of giving to Mission. Our Per Capita payment does not cover Mission. The Presbytery hopes to receive 366 gifts to the Mission fund of up to \$366 each to fill the budget gap. As a

reminder, the Presbytery gives \$12,000 each year to Copper Country Angel Mission through our church.

With 39 churches in the Presbytery and most of them much smaller than ours, this is indeed a challenge. To date, the Presbytery has received 11 gifts or 3% of their goal. These gifts, currently totaling close to \$3,800, are from individuals and churches. Individuals can give directly, noting "Leap Year Mission Gift Challenge" in the check memo, and sending it to:

Pastor Peter and Greg Campbell worked to reorganize the sanctuary furniture, returning the lectern to its "original" place on the altar as well as creating a safer path for the readers. This update will include a handrail on each end of the altar (donated by members), and a new microphone for the lectern that is easier to use. The goal is to make it as safe and simple as possible for readers to participate in worship services. Readers are asked to use the steps and handrail on the LEFT side of the altar area (near the piano), as this is the shortest path to the lectern.

Jim, Peter, and Greg are working together to replace the loudspeakers in the Sanctuary so people can hear better. The equipment is ready to install — we have been waiting for contractors since Easter! We are hopeful that this phase of the project will be completed by the end of July. Jim Northey and Peter continue to work toward updating the video streaming system, with a goal of completing this project by September. The projector will be replaced with a large wall-mounted video display, and the current "small" display used for Zoom participants will also be mounted on the South wall. We want to improve the aesthetics of our worship space and remove distractions as much as possible.

I have been asked to give periodic updates on the PLUC Helping Hands program. At this time 2024 seems to be following the same pattern as 2023. We had many requests the first quarter of the year. Then in May and June things slowed down with only one request in May and two in June. In July, we received 4 requests in one week, plus a 5th request a week later and a 6th request from someone who had already used up their eligibility for 2024..

Through July we have given out 12 food vouchers (13 in 2023) and 21 gas vouchers (22 in 2023) for a possible total of \$1,650.00. We might not have spent quite that much as not everyone uses their entire available \$50.00. We have received \$1,639.00 in donations so are currently meeting our need.

Thank you to all who help with this important mission of Portage Lake United Church. Your gifts are greatly appreciated.


