Fellowship Guild Updates: Liz Evensen presented the following updates from the Fellowship Guild:

- 1. A Thank you for the good response to the indoor clean up.
- 2. A Thank you for the new handrail to make it easier to get up the steps to the podiums
- 3. An update of the Fellowship Guild by-laws:
 - a. Update to be enacted as of 09/03/2024
 - b. All are welcome as members - not just women
 - c. Consistory oversees Fellowship Guild
 - d. By-laws have been streamlined to represent current practices.

Consistory approved the updated Fellowship Guild By-laws.

Elder A. Eckhart proposed that the Fellowship Guild By-laws be addressed in the church By-laws. Elder A. Eckhart and Pastor Norland will work on an addendum.

Discussion of Reports:

Angel Mission: Elder S. Middlemis-Brown reported that Angel Mission is helping many homes to deal with utilities shut-offs (up to \$200.00). They are also guiding people to get state help. The Food Pantry is very active. The Angel Mission building is being re-sided.

Building Use: Building improvements include new facia and a new handrail to help people get up the steps to the speaker podiums. The cleaning of the carpets was discussed, especially the Fellowship Hall. Hiring students to do this was discussed. Elder A. Campbell will check with the National Honor Society about possible "volunteers." Other possible volunteer opportunities could come from the MTU Student Leadership and Involvement office. Elder A. Eckhart will look into the cost for Rug Doctor equipment. Pastor's Report: Pastor Peter's parents

have requested a transfer of their membership to Portage Lake United Church. The letters that have been exchanged between the two churches amount to a transfer. Consistory approved the acceptance of John and Linda Norland as members of Portage Lake United Church. . Pastor Peter will be on vacation September 29, 2024 through October 6, 2024. Help

with coverage for those two Sundays will be needed.

Plans for new AV equipment was shared. Consistory approved pursuit of funding for the new AV plan, checking into Memorial Funds for possible ways to fund the project.

Consistory discussed pursuing ideas for new PLUC signage. Members will look online for ideas.

New Business:

Annual Presbytery Record Review: Elder T. Monson will check for the date of the September Presbytery review of the PLUC records. He believes he might be able to deliver the clerk books. He stated that Office Manager Smock does a good job of putting things together for the clerk.

The All Church Picnic will be held at the home of Bobbie and Dan Dalquist after worship on September 15, 2024. (Moved to September 22nd due to conflict with A Taste of Faith.)

In Other News

Angel Mission submitted by Sherry Middlemis-Brown

Lois had 166 students registered to receive a school backpack filled with supplies as of Aug 20. She is one busy lady. We all appreciate the support that church members have given to Lois and this program. With the high costs of everything right now, we are seeing a need for help with utilities and eviction prevention. We are now paying four assistance requests a month, limit of \$200 each and only one assistance in six months. We used to average one request a month. This is stretching us a little thin. Of course, the food pantry has also seen an increase in need over the last few months too. We hope that the guidance on what is needed by the food pantry has been helpful to church members.

We have begun phase one of a two phase project to complete making our building weather tight. We are replacing siding on the front and north side that are most visible from the street. We are complying with the Village of Calumet's Historical District Commission, which dictates the type of external covering we can use. This compliance has increased our costs, but it will be longer lasting than the most inexpensive siding. We won't be able to afford to install siding on the rear and south side of the building until 2025.

In July, the store workers contributed 324½ hours of time and the board contributed about 50 additional hours. The volunteer hours will go up for August and September with the many hours that Lois puts into the School Backpack Program.

Breaking News: We were faced with dipping deep into our building fund to pay for new siding on two sides of our building. The final payment was going to drop our balance below that which earns interest. That was sad, but necessary. Then along comes a very generous person with an IRA distribution check that plumped up our account and will keep our balance above the minimum to earn interest. Plus, that is a great gift to help cover siding the rest of the building next year. This is one of those "Just-in-time" events that are so common at Angel Mission.

Copper Country Angel Mission School Backpack Program

The Copper Country Angel Mission School Backpack Program grew by leaps and bounds this year. There was added publicity about the program in the community, and the community responded with overwhelming support. Dollar Bay School System helped us spread the word about the program by putting an email registration form on their school website, and 60 students signed up for backpacks that way. At this point 81 families have signed up for 189 students to receive backpacks. We were fortunate to have the help of 15 teenagers from a Lutheran camp group from Wisconsin come to help put together 90 of the backpacks. This past Saturday, August 24, families of the children were invited to come to the Angel Mission to pick the backpacks for their children and then be able to select new socks, underwear, and shoes for their children.

I especially want to thank the members of our church who made monetary donations and also school supply donations for the program. Our church has been very supportive of the School Backpack Program since it began ten + years ago.


MTU Faith Fair
