Consistory Highlights

Finance Committee Report: Bobbie Dalquist, co-chair of the Finance Committee gave a summary of the results of the Finance Committees latest meeting including a review of the 2024 budget and the initial projected 2025 budget.

- 1. Funding to pay Olivia Byykkonen to supervise Children's Church has been from a gift for Youth Activities. That funding will run out in January 2025. A possible potluck in January with the children helping to serve (possibly the desert) has been recommended.
- 2. Treasurer Ed will be asked to transfer approximately \$11,700.00 from the roof fund back to Vanguard.
- 3. The vonBatchelder fund is healthy and is available to help with funding if needed
- 4. The initial projected 2025 budget was projected on the 2024 spending levels.
- 5. The Finance Committee will meet
- 6. again in October prior to the meeting of the Congregation/Corporation in order to give the most up to date information for the meeting.

Consistory thanked Bobbie and the other members of the Finance Committee for their work.

Committee Reports:

- 1. Building and Grounds is investigating the cost of TVs to be placed on the sanctuary walls. One will be on the wall behind the audio/visual equipment to project who is joining the service on ZOOM. The other will be on the wall where the service information has been projected to serve the same function. The large TV and projector will no longer be needed.
- 2. Office Manager Smock thanked Elder A. Campbell for taking minutes at the last Consistory meeting as Smock was unable to attend due to Covid.
- 3. Pastor Peter reported that he has received feedback that people have missed the Celebration of the Season this year which was not held as Pastor Peter was on vacation for half of the time this would have been held. It will probably return next year.
- 4. Pastor Peter, along with two members of the congregation,

- attended the Community Luncheon hosted by Trinity Episcopal Church. This allowed for an opportunity to share with other members of the local faith community.
- 5. The Cooperative Campus Ministries Faith Fair and Taste of Faith event happened the week of September 9th. Thanks to Nancy Byers Sprague who coordinated volunteers to make salads for the Taste of Faith Event. Mary Eckart and Judy Albee attended the event and helped serve. Pastor Peter was able to mingle and meet with students. During the MTU Faith Fair Pastor Peter was able to meet many students, engage in a few good conversations, and give out a bunch of candy and stickers left over from the MTU Afternoon on the Town. Ann Campbell will be contacting the winners of the Jim's Food Mart voucher drawing.
- 6. **Upcoming Vacation:** Pastor Peter and Christina are taking a vacation Tuesday, September 24 through Tuesday, October 8. Jim Northey has agreed to lead worship on Sunday 9/29/24 and Dianne Sprague will lead us on 10/6/24. Thank you!
- 7. Elder A. Eckhart helped serve communion for the first time in September. In October, Elder D. Sprague will lead communion (while Pastor Peter is on vacation), assisted by Standing Elder G. Campbell.
- 8. Angel Mission is still trying to find someone who could help make a video presentation of work done by Angel Mission.

Old Business:

Carpet Cleaning: Elder A. Campbell contacted the Houghton High School Honor Society Advisor regarding cleaning the carpet as their community service project. The students will consider this at their next meeting. Elder A. Eckhart has been obtaining estimates from local professional carpet cleaning companies. Groups that use the church have donated \$200.00 toward the cleaning of the carpet. Consistory approved Elder A. Eckhart to investigate and negotiate the cost of cleaning the carpet up to \$1,000.00. **Signage:** Pastor Peter shared some stickers he had made and passed out at the Faith Fair. He said these stickers created some conversations with students. He also shared a large banner he had made (basically our letterhead) for approximately \$25.00. He also shared that he had been investigating other types of permanent signage and has found it to be quite expensive.

New Business:

Children's Church: As mentioned during the Finance Committee report, funding to pay Olivia Byykkonen for supervising Children's Church will run out in January. Ways to continue the funding will be explored.

Fellowship Guild will be hosting a luncheon in which they would like to invite Roger Helman to discuss estate planning (with an eye toward including the church in a person's plan). Pastor Peter will contact Roger to see if he would be willing to do this.

Report from September Presbytery of Mackinac Meeting

Being the fall meeting, there was much discussion of and decisions about financial issues. Our Presbytery understands the problem of diminishing congregations and limited financial resources. Two types of income support the Presbytery, Synod, and General Assembly, Per Capita and Basic Mission. Currently, neither income from our 39 churches is adequate to support the Presbytery, in part because only 87% of Per Capita is paid by churches and some churches do not give to Basic Mission. Presbytery uses reserves to cover the difference, just as we are doing.

Despite shortfalls in Mission Funds, Angel Mission received an increase in support for 2025. Additionally, Presbyterian Women at the Presbytery level has disbanded and will

give part of their remaining funds to CCAM. We are truly blessed to have such the strong, continuing support from Presbytery for our local mission. Besides CCAM, the Presbytery only supports Presbytery Point. I have submitted some of the documents from the meeting to the office, including lists of individuals filling positions within the Presbytery. The next meeting is via Zoom on February 22, 2025.

We can only afford to do the visible half of the building this year. The 2024 sections are nearing completion, and we hope to have funding to complete the second half of the siding in 2025.
