Consistory Highlights

Pastor Peter welcomed incoming Consistory members Biruta Lowther and Beth Smock who are attending this meeting to enable them to be familiar with current areas of work being done by Consistory. Both have previously sat on the Consistory and, therefore, are already ordained. They will be installed as Seated Members during Worship on June 19, 2025.

Discussion of Consent Agenda items:

Office Manager/Financial Secretary Report:

Office Manager Smock shared a thank you note to Consistory from Nancy Byers Sprague and Dianne Sprague for the use of the church for their annual Easter Dinner. Elder D. Sprague shared that they fed 90 people at the dinner.

Building and Grounds:

The annual spring clean up took place on Saturday, May 17, 2025 with a large crowd of hearty (it was cold) people working to clean up both the outside and inside of the church. It looks really nice.

Elder A. Eckhart reported that all of the fire safety updates are completed with the exception of the Exit Signs and Fire Alarms. Bulbs for the current Exit Signs are on order but he has learned that our current signs are not up to code. Therefore, he will be purchasing new signs but will use the bulbs on order in the current signs until the new signs arrive. Investigative work continues to find the appropriate Fire Alarms. Consistory approved up to \$500.00 for the new Exit Signs and Fire Alarms. Consistory thanks Elder Eckart for all his hard work getting PLUC up to fire safety standards.

Pastor Report:

Elder A. Campbell assisted with May communion. Elder A. Eckhart will assist in June.

Old Business:

Presbytery Point Special Meeting:

Pastor Peter and Elder S. Middlemis-Brown participated in a special meeting held to discuss further training for counselors at Presbytery Point and to establish a commission to investigate and make recommendations on all aspects of Presbytery Point. More information will be shared after the commission finishes its investigation and shares its recommendations.

Personnel:

Office Manager/Financial Secretary and PLUC Minister of Music completed Self-Evaluations of their job performance. Consistory reviewed and discussed the job descriptions and self-evaluations (Office Manager Smock stepped out of the meeting while her information was discussed).

Christians Against Christian Nationalism

The possibility of investigating local interest in a Christians Against Christian Nationalism group was discussed. There was concern expressed about mixing church and politics. Consistory decided to not pursue this at this time. Several members did take more information about the group.

New Business:

Consistory Organization

As Consistory says good-bye to members who are finishing their terms and greeting new members, a discussion was held about the organization of Church leadership. We have 4 Committees which are viewed as "necessary" to efficient church leadership (Finance, Building and Grounds, Nominating, and Personnel). Consistory thought about what other Committees might be necessary or if it might be best to look for people who might be interested in participating in different "groups" as need arises. It was felt that this would be better than having a Committee that hasn't met in months. People could be asked to be in groups that specifically meet their interests and skill sets. This will be discussed further during future meetings.

Quote for tuckpointing chimney

When the chimney was cleaned as part of the fire safety upgrade is was discovered that the chimney needed tuckpointing. A quote was received from the company cleaning the chimney for \$4600.00. Consistory found this quote to be very expensive. Elder A. Eckhart recommended going up on the roof to see how much damage there is to the chimney and then seeking more estimates. Elder Eckhart will include this in his fire safety work.

Credit Card

The company from which PLUC has a credit card unexpectedly cancelled the card. Consistory asked Office Manager/Financial Secretary Smock to contact Superior National Bank for a credit card.

Consistory Meeting Time

The current meeting time of the 3rd Tuesday of the month at 6:00 pm works for the incoming Consistory members, so will be continued. The next meeting will be on Tuesday, June 17, 2025 at 6:00 pm.

This is the last meeting for Elders D. Sprague and A. Campbell. Consistory thanked them for their work during the last three years as leaders of our church family

Helping Hands

I know that I am starting to sound like a broken record asking for help with funding Helping Hands. However, this year has presented challenges to all agencies and

churches providing assistance to those in need. As of this week, we have given out 29 food and/or gas vouchers for a total of \$1,450.00. That does not mean we have spent that much as not everyone uses the entire \$50.00 available, especially since we have given out more gas vouchers than for food. At this time we still are slightly ahead in donations received, having received \$1,583.00 so far. However, I am not sure we will continue to have more than we are giving out. The 29 vouchers so far this year are more than half of the 55 we gave out all of 2024. Households can make two requests for help a year. So far, only 2 households have used up their eligibility. And while I wish I could keep politics out of this, the reality is that all agencies are concerned about decreases in funding due to governmental policies. I would ask that you prayerfully consider donating to this very worthy mission of PLUC. Thank you.
