### Discussion of Consent Agenda items: Pastor's Report:

He has developed and posted emergency exit routes, purchased and placed new fire extinguisher, and cleaned out the furnace room. The trash bin has been moved out of the furnace room. He is still working on a new fire detector system.
- 2. Elder A. Eckhart is also investigating a new locking system for the church building.

#### **Building Fire Safety Upgrades**

At their February meeting, during a discussion about the church fire insurance policy, Consistory decided to have the building inspected and to follow up on any upgrade suggestions. Al Eckart, a member of both Consistory and the Building and

Grounds Committee, took leadership of this effort.

An inspection was completed by Houghton Fire Chief Eric James on February 27, 2025. Results showed the following needed improvements/upgrades:

- 1. Light bulb replacement in 2 exit lights.
- 2. Posting of fire evacuation route signs.
- 3. Clean out the furnace room, making sure it is clear of combustible clutter.
- 4. Upgrade fire extinguishers.
- 5. Install hard-wired fire detection devices (the church currently has none).

Al immediately got to work on these upgrades. You will notice new exit route signs throughout the church. Please check this out so you will be aware of exits in case of emergency. He also purchased new fire extinguishers, both replacing old ones and adding a couple more in needed locations. He has tried to change the light blubs in the exit signs but is having trouble finding the correct size. Several people helped in cleaning out the furnace room. We ask that people help keep the area clean and free of clutter

At this time, Al and Pastor Peter are still exploring options for the hard-wired fire detection devices. Once these are installed, they will not only let people at the church know there is a fire, but will also automatically contact the fire department and Pastor Peter (on his phone).

Though this was not included in the Fire Chief's report, Al will be looking into having the fire place and chimney cleaned.

We thank Al for all his work on this very important project. Once everything is done, we might have a potluck to show everyone the results of his work.

Our major concern is that with the current social relief trends, we could see many more people needing our help. We want to be in a financial position to assist them and a larger monthly payment would limit our ability to expand needed programs. We hope that our caution is unnecessary and that we can pay more than the minimum amount monthly and so pay down the principal.

We are preparing for Kids' Shopping for Mother's Day to be held on May 10. We stopped Kids' Shopping during COVID and this will be the first time getting back to it. We'll see how it goes before committing to other Kids' Shopping this year. Thank you to everyone who has donated gift bags and tissue paper, as well as those contributing gifts for the kids to select.

Already, we are working with The Salvation Army volunteers to broaden the scope of our School Backpack Program. We will keep you in the loop as our plans progress. Additionally, the CLK Council of Churches Food Pantry and our food pantry volunteers are exploring ways that we can improve efficiency and effectiveness of our attempts to reduce food insecurity in the area.

We continue to see God's blessings in the work being done through CCAM. Through partnerships, we reach out farther into the community and create more efficient and effective programs.
