Discussion of Consent Agenda items:

Pastor Report:

- 1. Elder A. Eckhart assisted with June communion. Elder B. Lowther will assist in July.
- 2. Pastor Peter led two memorial services: one for Doug Stuart and another for his father, John Noland which was held in Minnesota. Pastor Peter thanked all those who assisted with the service and luncheon for Doug Stuart.
- 3. We are now in "Ordinary Time" which is between Trinity Sunday and Christ the King Sunday. In September we will celebrate "Peace with Creation" during "Signs of the Season."

Finances:

1. All church finances are tracking in good shape.

Old Business:

Chimney Tuckpointing: Elder A. Eckhart has a contractor coming the week of June 15 for an estimate for the tuckpointing of the chimney. He has three other contractors who might be interested.

Consistory Re-organization: Consistory will continue to address issues as they arise.

Church Credit Card: Office Manager Smock reported that we had received notice that our application for a church credit card had been denied. She contacted the lending agency and learned that they need our EIN approval letter. Smock will work with Treasurer Lowther to get this information to them.

Outdoor Signage: Consistory had previously discussed outdoor signage in order to make the church more visible. Signage in front would make PLUC more obvious to those traveling on Highway 41. There is nothing along Houghton Ave. that would indicate to those students, and others, walking to and from campus that PLUC is a place of worship. Pastor Peter

stated that he would look further into better outdoor signage for the church.
